Materials list for all Students working in Oil, Alkyd Oil or Acrylic:

- Apron or smock (both acrylic and oil paints won't come out of clothing)
- Suggested: Sealable Masterson stay wet palette: (well worth the investment*) <u>https://a.co/d/bM71tkx</u>
- Disposable paper palette insert for Masterson: https://a.co/d/5GpqBhS
- Or any disposable palette avail on Amazon or at Blick Art Supply
- Pencils, pens and/or charcoal
- Eraser
- 2 canvas boards (11x14 or 12x16) 3-6 stretched & primed canvases (any of the following sizes: 24x36, 30x40, 36x48), some canvases come in set listed below*
- Box of latex gloves (Costco has them) a <u>must for oil painters</u>*
- Paper towels or cotton rags or an old t-shirt
- Favorite photos* from travel, people, pets, garden from a magazine will be used for reference materials for some exercises and lessons. Invest some time finding images meaningful to you**
- 3-5 Color images (postcard, calendar) of favorite paintings by master artists (Matisse, Picasso, Monet, <u>invest some time in sourcing these images</u>** from a bookstore or online)

Materials list for Students working in Acrylic (Dries fast, non-toxic):

- Apron or smock
- Disposable paper palette, or paper plates
- Spray bottle with water* (a must to keep paints wet while working)
- Container for water
- Acrylic gel medium, Gloss or satin (liquidex or golden brands, makes paints more fluid and similar in blending to oils**)
- Acrylic Brushes: Get a set with flats, filberts and rounds and one fan tail*, ¼", ½" and 1" or whatever else you may have on hand. (some sets come in a zippered pouch on Amazon)

- Acrylic paint: easiest to purchase a complete set online, 36-72 small/med size paints or Titanium white, black ivory, cadmium yellow med, cadmium yellow light, cadmium red med, cobalt blue, ultra-marine blue, payne's grey, burnt umber, raw umber, raw sienna,
- <u>OR Purchase a Painting Set (brushes and paints</u> included w/easel, not required but helpful if you don't have above paints and brushes on hand, cost effective as well*) some suggested options

Materials list for Students working in oil (Dries slowly, good for blending but can be toxic w/out ventilation & proper safety precautions, which I will teach*):

- Apron or smock
- Latex gloves, 3 sets per class (a must for working in oil, can get a box at Costco)
- Disposable paper palette or Masterson palette setup listed above
- Oil Painting kit if you don't have oils and setup on hand:

- Palette knife for mixing paints (some come in kits, metal is ideal*)
- Liquin (a must, speeds oil drying time*)

- Bottle of cooking oil (corn, vegetable, safflower can get at dollar store)
- Turpenoid (less odor than mineral spirits, safer, thins paints, cleans brushes)

- Oil paint: titanium white, black, cadmium yellow medium, cadmium yellow light, cadmium red light, ultra-marine blue, pthalo blue, burnt umber, raw umber, red-oxide, magenta and yellow ochre, paynes grey* (*avoid flake white*, has lead in it)
