

## Which visa should I choose?

UC San Diego Extension International Programs is authorized to issue Form I-20 for F-1 Student Visas and Form DS2019 for J-1 Exchange Visitor Student Visas. To determine which is the appropriate visa for you, refer to the chart below to view eligibility requirements for each type of visa, and to compare the advantages and disadvantages of each one.

Comparing F-1 and J-1 Student visa Eligibility Requirements and Benefits

Two-year Home Residence Requirement (212e)	Not applicable to students in F-1 status	J-1 student and J-2 dependent(s) may be subject depending on the following:  • Source of funding  • Home country skills list  • Medical education or training If subject to 212(e), you are required to return to your country of nationality or last legal residence for two years upon completion of J-1 program before being eligible for certain immigration benefits.
